This project aims to promote the use of environmental education as a tool to combat the wild animal trafficking and the prevention of zoonosis through the integration amoung IBAMA-PI and environmental education as a tool to combat the public and private education systems.

Teachers will have access to diverse information about the wild animal traffic, such as: mortality rate, maltreatment during capture and transportation, as well as about the risk of catching diseases from these animals, illegally acquired and taken to homes.

Thus, the Liberty and Health Project assumes that the citizen, aware of the traffic ravages, will not buy illegal wild animal. Consequently, will not expose themselves to the wild zoonosis, resulting in economic and environmental gains for Brazil.
